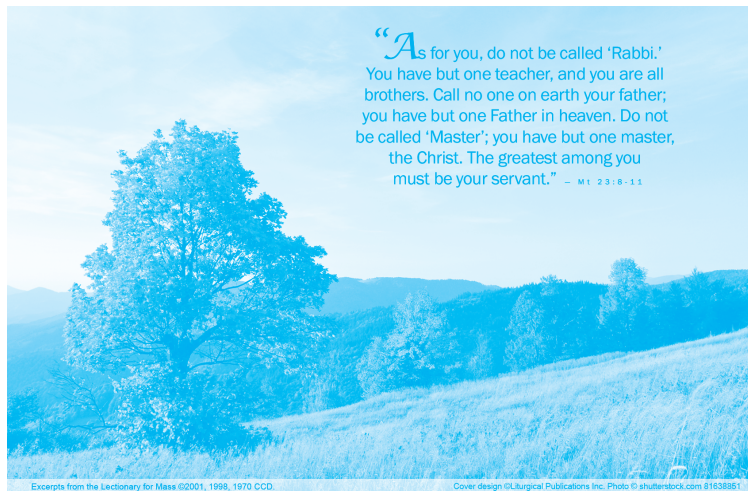

Let us try to be more attentive to those who may feel isolated, for it is Christ Himself we minister: *“Whatever you do for the least of these, you do for me:”* (Matthew 25:40)
